

WHEN A LICENSE IS NEEDED

A facility requires a license if it meets one of the following conditions:

- A. Provides care and supervision, which is defined as the following:
 - 1. Assist with activities of daily living including dressing, grooming, bathing, and hygiene.
 - 2. Assist with medications, coordinates prescriptions with pharmacies, and centrally storing medications when the residents do not have access on their own.
 - 3. Arranging medical and dental care.
 - 4. Maintains house rules-for the protection of the residents.
 - 5. Supervises client schedules and activities.
 - 6. Maintains or supervises client cash resources or property.
 - 7. Monitors food intake or special diets.
 - 8. Handling resident's monies
- B. The facility represents itself as providing care and supervision.
- C. The facility accepts or retains residents who demonstrate the need for care and supervision. This includes persons placed by a placing agency, family members or by themselves for temporary or permanent care.
- D. Independent Living Homes may provide housing and meals to residents who do not need care and supervision and who can access personal and other necessary services independently.
